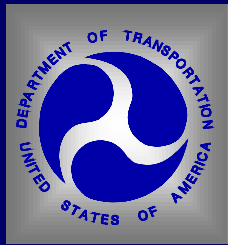

On April 19, 2007 FRA announced the formation of the Door Task Group.

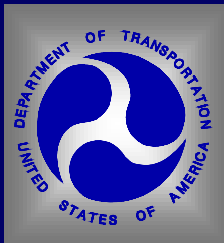
Given two tasks:

2. Develop regulations to reduce the risk.



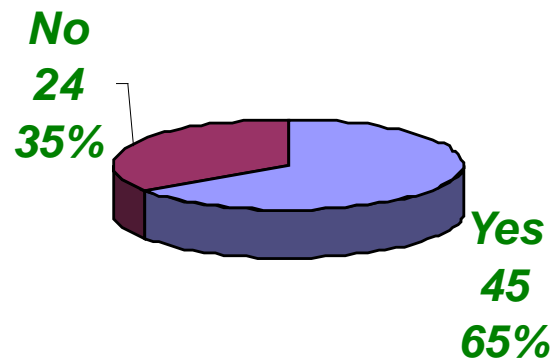
The FRA team audited 23 railroads, documenting the risks



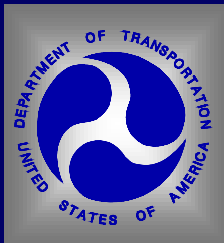

Door?**

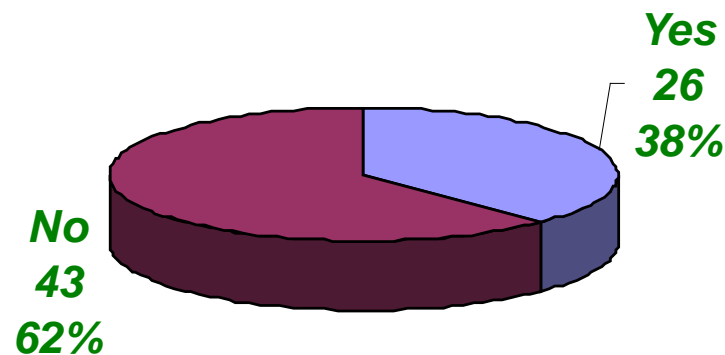

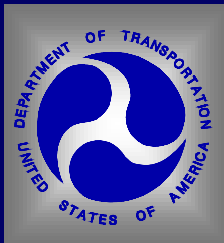

Door & the Train Move?**

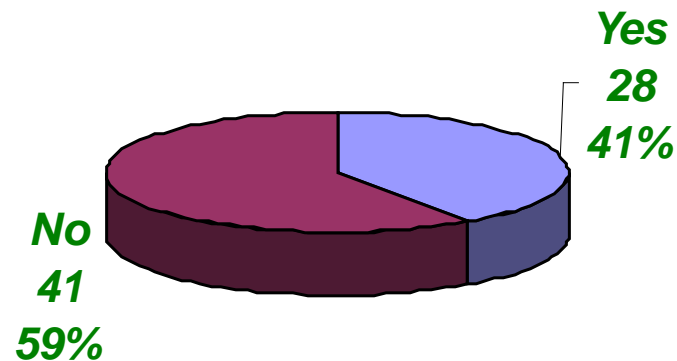

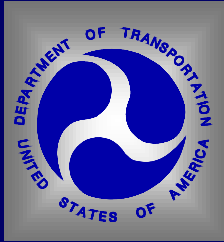

Can Train Move?**

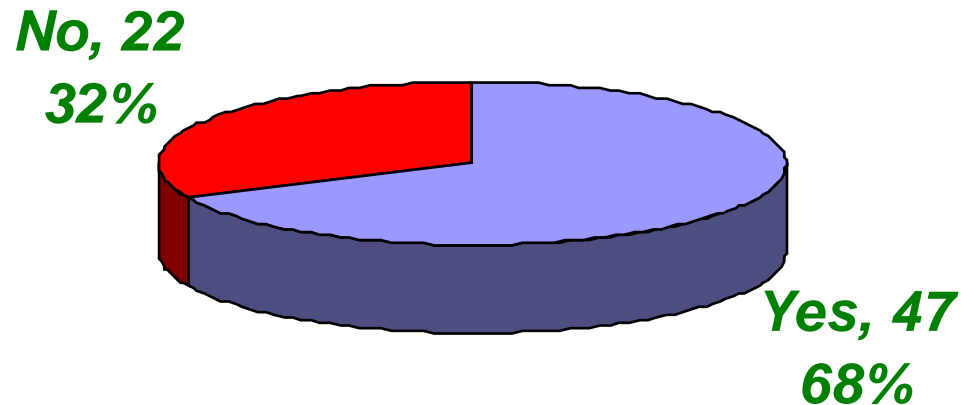

Consensus Reached with Task Group

After seven meetings, the Door Task Force reached consensus on 47 items that will reduce the safety risks with passenger train side doors.

Operating with doors open

"All passenger train exterior side doors and traps must be closed when a train is in motion between stations"

There are three exceptions.

There are means for a railroad to seek special consideration from this.



Recap of other important parts
